Although the UK is leaving the EU, the present Home Secretary, Amber Rudd, has said that she wants us to *remain* a participant in the EAW. She also said that she wants the UK to remain part of EUROPOL (which is not just a European branch of Interpol, but the EU's intended embryo 'FBI', ie the EU's federal police force).

Although an EU member, Denmark is *not* part of Europol but has a cooperation agreement to share intelligence for criminal investigations. We can do likewise.

When she was Home Secretary, Mrs May, the present Prime Minister, said that she would "of course" authorise the deployment of "special intervention units from our EU allies" (that is the lethally-armed paramilitary European Gendarmerie) within the UK. (Hansard, written answers for 11/06/2012)

**If elected, will you work and vote to ban all foreign forces from being used here for keeping order or law enforcement?      YES      NO**

Of course, Britain is able to cooperate with other countries in the fight against crime. Criminals who flee here from other countries should be made to face justice.

A reasonable set of guidelines for extraditing suspected criminals would include:

1. A definite charge to be brought
2. *Prima facie* evidence to show there is a case to answer; to be weighed in a British court.
3. The charge to be one which is an offence under British law
4. A guarantee by the country seeking extradition that the case will be brought to trial in open court within a reasonable period. In Scotland this is 110 days, after which prisoners on remand must either be brought to trial or be bailed.
